1. Civic Stadium rental rates are due to expire December 31, 1995;

2. Studies concerning M.E.R.C. operations and, specifically, Civic Stadium's future will reach conclusions within the next six months but after current rental rates expire;

3. Extension provides working rental rates for an additional six months;

4. Extension provides a timeframe in which staff can research rental rates;

5. Extension brings rental rate schedule in sync with M.E.R.C.'s budget year;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Commission approves and authorizes the extension of Civic Stadium's rental rates for an additional six months to expire June 30, 1996.

MERC STAFF REPORT

Agenda Item/Issue: Extension of Civic Stadium Rental Rates

DATE: November 8, 1995

<u>Background and Analysis:</u> Civic Stadium is in the third year of a three-year rental rate structure passed by the Commission as part of Resolution No. 202 on October 14, 1992. The rental rates span the three calendar years of 1993 through 1995 and expire this December. Current Rental Rates are attached.

Our two anchor tenants, the Portland Rockies and Portland State University (football program), have negotiated multi-year rental license agreements which set them outside the application of the standard rental rate structure. Additionally, the promoter for our Summer Concert Series negotiates a cap on rental fees, so the percentage rate applies only up to that point. Users to which the rental rate structure are applied, then, are college sports (excluding PSU football), high school sports and various community activities.

The expiration of rental rates comes as the City/Metro Facilities Consolidation Advisory Committee nears its conclusions which may substantially affect the ways in which M.E.R.C. operates. Also, it is anticipated a work group will be formed specifically to explore the future of Civic Stadium and to formulate recommendations and an action plan. Staff looks for this group to be underway in late November with the goal of arriving at conclusions within the next six months.

Current rental rate increases are on a calendar year and do not correlate with our budget year process.

<u>Discussion with the Commission Liaisons and/or User Groups</u>: Staff has had a short discussion with Liaison Commissioner Ben Middleton. User groups will be notified of extension.

Fiscal Impact: Financial impact to Civic Stadium's budget will be minimal. The six-month extension comes during the facility's slow booking time.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Staff recommends extension of the current rental rate structure to expire June 30, 1996 for the following reasons:

1. Extension provides working rental rates for the six months the Stadium work group will be conducting its work on the Civic Stadium's future.

2. The six-month extension provides a timeframe in which staff can research rental rates, conducting surveys with other facilities and the facility users.

3. Extension brings the rental rate schedule in sync with M.E.R.C.'s budget year.

Event related labor/services: Shall be provided by the facility at Licensee's expense. All event requirements shall be approved by facility management at least fourteen (14) days prior to the beginning of the event.

Facility Management reserves the right to provide a full range of food and beverage services.
