## **RESOLUTION NO. 97-32**

Approval to exercise MERC contract option of one (1) year extension on contracts for temporary personnel services for light industrial labor. Rates to be adjusted to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index for Portland, Oregon. Contracts expire June 30, 1997.

The Metropolitan Exposition - Recreation Commission finds:

1. That the current contracts for temporary light industrial personnel services expire June 30, 1997 with the following companies:

- 2. That the use of temporary light industrial labor has been economically advantageous to the operation of the Expo Center, Civic Stadium, the Portland Center for the Performing Arts, and the Oregon Convention Center.
- 3. That the Commission desires to continue to utilize temporary personnel services at the Expo Center, Civic Stadium, the Portland Center for the Performing Arts, and the Oregon Convention Center.
- 4. That the Commission should exercise it's option to extend the current contracts to June 30, 1998
- 5. That a rate increase of no more than 3.8% should be added to the contracts for services to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index for Portland, Oregon as stated in the contracts.
- 6. That \$210,000 is budgeted in the 1997 / 98 fiscal year budget for these services.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Metropolitan Exposition - Recreation Commission's General Manager is authorized to execute, on the behalf of the Commission, an extension to the current contracts for the period July 1, 1997 through June 30, 1998 for temporary light industrial personnel services, in conformance with this resolution.

## MERC STAFF REPORT

Agenda Item/Issue: One Year Contract Extension of Light Industrial Temporary Labor

Background and Analysis: In June of 1996 the Metropolitan Exposition - Recreation Commission passed Resolution 96-43 authorizing the General Manager to enter into light industrial temporary personnel service agreements with Employers Overload, Beginright, Inc., and Barrett Business Services. All were selected as a result of the IFB process which included eight (8) prospective bidders. These agreements provide for two (2) one-year (1-year) renewal options with rates to be adjusted to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index for Portland, Oregon. Staff have utilized personnel from all three services and are satisfied with their performance in providing light industrial temporary personnel.

## \* As requested by Commissioner Artharee:

The IFB notice was sent in May of 1996 to a total of 27 firms including 5 located in the MERC Target Area of which 3 were state certified MBE businesses. Notice of the IFB was published in 3 papers. Final IFB submission of 8 bidders resulted in 2 state certified MBE Target Area businesses submitting bids. Only one of the MBE businesses was listed by the state as providing light industrial temporary labor personnel. Hourly bill rates from these two firms were the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> highest bids received. Contracts that were awarded were non-exclusive and MERC could still utilize other firms if these firms could not provide temporary personnel as needed.

In addition to these contractors we are currently using a certified Target Area MBE firm for janitorial services at the EXPO Center. Along with this firm are two other certified Target Area businesses providing services and personnel to Fine Host Corp. at each of the facilities. Expenditures for janitorial services YTD are \$64,570. Expenditures by Fine Host Corp. are not directly available since they do there own contracting for these services, but it is estimated to be over \$150,000 a year. All these amounts are dependent on the number and types of events held.

Fiscal Impact: 1997-1998 proposed budget amount for temporary personnel at MERC facilities is \$210,000.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Metropolitan Exposition - Recreation Commission approve a one (1) year extension to Employers Overload, Beginright, Inc., and Barrett Business Services, for a period to commence July 1, 1997 and end June 30, 1998 with rates adjusted no more than 3.8% to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index for Portland, Oregon as updated through December 1996 and published February 1997.
