Resolution 98 - 2

Approval of PCPA Rental Rates for FY 1998-99, 1999-00, 2000-01.

The Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission finds:

1. Under the 1994 PCPA Business Plan, changes in policy were instituted to maximize operating revenue through increases in rental and other charges in relation to market conditions and user ability to pay for facilities.

2. After extensive research and community discussion, the Commission approved a 4-tier rental structure along with acceptance of specific organizations as qualified for Tier 3 (Featured Tenant) and Tier 4 (Principal Tenant); this rental structure and policy has proven effective in attaining increased rental revenues since July 1, 1995.

3. Under the new policy, PCPA rates were set on a 3-year basis to enable MERC and its customers to plan and budget on a long-term basis; this predictability has proven beneficial to both PCPA and its users, allowing the parties to contract future events based on established rates.

4. The public discussions for development of the 1998 PCPA Business Plan confirmed that the policy for a 4-tier PCPA rent schedule should be continued, with adoption of rates for the next 3 fiscal years no later than January, 1998.

5. That the number of organizations in Tier 3 and Tier 4 categories shall not exceed the total of 14, without prior approval of the Commission, and provided that named non-profit organizations in Tier 3 and Tier 4 shall meet applicable standards, their designation shall be continued for 3 additional fiscal years through June 30, 2001

Be it therefore resolved that the Metropolitan Exposition- Recreation Commission approves the PCPA rental rates for FY 1998-99, 1999-00, and 2000-01 attached as Exhibit "A".

Rent Rate Guidelines for increases 1998-2001

- 1. Tier 1: Large halls increase \$100/yr = 12 % 3 yrs. Small halls increase 4% /year rounded
- 2. Rehearsal/Load-in at large halls = 50% of evening rate
- 3. Non-ticketed (user fee) event @ large halls = 140% of rent
- 4. Matinee at large halls = 75% of evening rates
- 5. Morning performance rate = 40% of evening rate
- 6. Stop publishing half house rate at large halls; available at discretion of management
- 7. Lobby events = \$325 more at ASCH Civic and Rotunda are equal price
- 8. Matinees and mornings at small halls = same as evening events for Tiers 1, 2, & 3
- 9. Graduation rate \$500 off commercial rate

10. Load-in, load-out, rate at Intermediate and Winningstad same for Tiers 1 and 2

11. Tier 4 rates adjusted in standard increments (\$10, 25, etc.) per year from 1995-96 through 2000-01

Background and Analysis: In 1994-95, staff conducted extensive research and analysis to evaluate rental policies and rates which would maximize operating revenue earnings, while recognizing prevailing market rates and the ability of users to pay for use of facilities. This information, together with community discussion, provided the basis for the 4-tier rental structure (adjusted annually for 3 years) which was adopted in January, 1995 to become effective in next fiscal year. Under the 1995 Rental Policy, 9 non-profit resident companies were approved as Principal Tenants (Tier 4), and 5 non-profit resident companies were approved as Featured Tenants (Tier 3). The policy set a maximum of 14 organizations to be recognized by the Commission in these two categories for local producing arts organizations. As reviewed for the 1998 Business Plan, the rental policies and rates have proven to be acceptable to the categories of users, and effective in increasing rental revenue to PCPA. The rate schedules proposed for FY 1998-99, 1999-00 and 200-01 have been distributed broadly and reviewed in conjunction with the 1998 Business Plan. In general, Tier 1 rates increase 4 percent per annum, and serve as the basis for calculating the other rates: Tier 2 = 10% discount; Tier 3 = 50% discount; Tier 4 = 80% discount.

Fiscal Impact: The 1995 Rental Policy and Rental Rates have proven effective as a means for increasing PCPA operating revenue in the fiscal years since July 1, 1995. Extension of the policies and adoption of the rates assures that such income will continue to grow at no less than 4 percent per annum, which is consistent with long-term financial plan forecasting.

Discussion with Commission Liaison and/or Users: The PCPA Advisory Committee and constituent users have had extensive involvement in Business Plan discussions, and in reviewing the specific rates proposed for the next 3 fiscal years. There have been no objections to any of these recommendations.

Recommendation: Staff recommend that the Commission adopt the 4-tier schedule of rents for FY 1998-99, 1999-00, and 2000-01 attached to the Resolution.
