Authoring the Oregon Convention Center Director to execute a one-year extension to the City Center Parking Agreement for the management of the Oregon Convention Center parking lot for a period commencing July 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2000.

The Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission finds:

- 1. That the Oregon Convention Center parking lot management has been efficiently handled by City Center Parking for the past three years.
- 2. That the Oregon Convention Center parking lot needs professional management and staffing of its parking lot, which currently cannot be provided by in-house staff.
- That the Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission, by contract, has the authority to enter into and extend personal services agreements, for the Oregon Convention Center.
- 4. That the current contract has options to extend this Agreement for two one-year periods.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission approves the extension to the City Center Parking Agreement for the management of the Oregon Convention Center parking lot for a period of one (1) year, commencing July 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2000; and directs the Oregon Convention Center Director to execute such an extension of this agreement on behalf of the Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission.

Background and Analysis: The Oregon Convention Center entered into a management agreement with City Center Parking in June of 1995 as of a result of an RFP process. The Agreement was for three years with two one-year options. The initial 3-year agreement expires on June 30, 1999. Staff has been very pleased with the operation of its parking lot through City Center over the past three years. City Center has been very responsive to OCC needs as well as dealing most effectively with the public.

Fiscal Impact: The FY 1999-2000 OCC operation budget has adequate funds in the appropriate line item for the extension of this Agreement.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission approve a one year extension to the City Center Parking Management Agreement to commence July 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2000, with all terms of the initial contract to remain the same.
