ISSUE ADDRESSED: Historically, the metropolitan service district (Metro), has been viewed as a creature of the legislature. The legislative assembly has retained significant control over Metro through its enabling statute. The Task Force on Metropolitan Regional Government, examining the legislative v. local control question, recommended that Metro be allowed to adopt a home-rule charter. This would alleviate the necessity for Metro to continually ask the legislature for every needed change.

PROVISIONS OF MEASURE AS REPORTED OUT: SJR 2, as amended, proposes to amend the Oregon Constitution to require the Legislative Assembly to provide a procedure whereby Metro may develop and adopt a home-rule charter. The charter prescribes the governing structure for Metro and the exercise of certain powers and duties, within the confines of the state constitution and state law.

MAJOR POINTS DISCUSSED: Committee discussion centered on the relationship of a Metro home-rule charter with existing city and county home-rule charters. Also discussed was the wisdom of including specific duties of the district in the Oregon Constitution, rather than within the charter itself.

EFFECTS OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS: Amendments to the joint resolution remove language regarding specific powers of Metro. The removal of this language was done so that actual language within the Oregon Constitution remains more general rather than specific, so that future changes in the constitution would not be necessary as the district evolves.

ISSUE ADDRESSED:

Since its formation in 1978, Metro has been viewed by many as a creation of the legislative assembly, dependent upon the legislature to determine its structure, boundaries, powers, and policies. There has been a significant debate in the Portland metropolitan area concerning legislative vs. local control of Metro and its role in the community.

PROVISIONS OF MEASURE AS REPORTED OUT:

SJR 2, as amended, proposes that the state constitution be amended to permit Metro to have its own charter, similar to the existing constitutional "home rule" charter authority granted to Oregon's counties. The Legislative Assembly would be responsible for establishing a procedure whereby the electors within Metro could vote to adopt, amend, revise or repeal a district charter.

The charter would establish a governing structure for Metro, including the distribution of powers and authority among its elected officers. The charter also could provide for the exercise by ordinance of any powers granted to the district under the state constitution or by statute and "jurisdiction over matters of metropolitan concern as set forth in the charter".

The proposed constitutional amendment would be voted on at the 1990 general election.

MAJOR POINTS DISCUSSED:

The committee discussed the need for a greater local determination of the role of Metro, the ability of local voters to use a charter to give Metro functions and powers currently not specifically provided by statute, and the charter development process.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amendments added the language to allow the charter to permit Metro to exercise jurisdiction over matters of metropolitan concern.
