ANNOUNCER: Ballot Measure 26-3 says it will limit Metro's powers and give local voters control of Metro. The problem is what it says is just the opposite of what it does. Twenty-six-3 would actually expand their authority and make us pay more taxes; nearly eight-million dollars more a year than their current budget. In fact, they could raise taxes without voter approval by calling it an excise tax or a surcharge. Imagine a tax on the food you buy in a restaurant, a tax on your movie ticket, even a tax when you sell your home.

Now, that doesn't sound like limiting Metro's powers. It sounds like a deliberate attempt to hide the truth. Some people have even called it fraudulent. Once you know the truth, I think you'll agree, 26-3 is not for me.

Vote no on the Metro Charter 26-3.
