PROPOSED METRO CHARTER HEARINGS SCHEDULED

Starting this week the public will have a chance give to their opinions on regionalization of government functions. Three hearings on a home rule charter, or constitution, written for Metro, will be held around the tri-county area on June 25, 29 and 30.

Metro is a regional government that provides urban growth planning, coordinates solid waste for the region, and operates the Zoo, Memorial Coliseum, Convention Center, Civic Stadium and the Center for the Performing Arts.

It is the only regional government in the nation that is directly elected by the people it serves.

The charter was written by a committee of 16 local citizens, appointed by Metro, local and state government. Issues they addressed include the structure of the government, what functions it should be doing for the people of the region, and how it should continue to be financed.
