RE:

Proposed Charter Language on Finance

Based on your cursory briefing on the proposed charter language for finance, I have a few issues and questions:

- 1. Are the excise tax spending ratios intended as a proportion of total dollars spent? Total dollars levied? or something else?
- 2. What if the overhead category is underspent, pushing up the percentage spent on planning? Is that a charter violation?
- 3. There is no provision for contingency and unappropriated balance. Currently 13.6% of the General Fund is in these categories. This is necessary for prudent management. How will these needs be provided for in the ratios?
- 4. On what basis will the \$6 million cap be increased? The level of excise tax funding needs to be linked to the activity level and needs of the organization.
- 5. What funding source is envisioned for Metro's known short-term needs if niche taxes are limited to \$1 million? As presented in Councilor Gardner's testimony to the Committee, PCPA, Zoo, Planning, Arts, and Greenspaces will require much more than \$1 million annually within five years.
- 6. At the current level of excise tax funding a 37% cut would be needed to keep general government overhead at 30% of the levied amount. How will this be accomplished when new costs are contemplated such as an auditor?

These are just a few quick thoughts. I am sure my list will grow after I sleep on it. I have attached a summary showing how the local government dues are budgeted for FY 1992-93.
