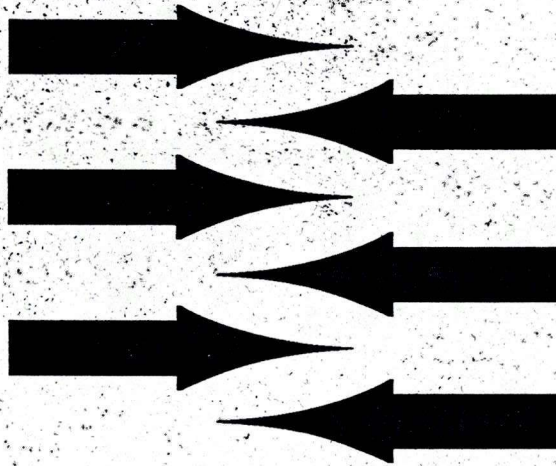

Metropolitan Toronto is Canada's leading centre of commerce, culture and industry, and includes the capital of Ontario.

The Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto has evolved over the 37 years of its existence into a mature government responsible for managing its affairs and delivering services to 2.2 million residents.

In fact, today Metro is larger in population than six provinces, has an annual operating and capital budget of \$3.2 billion and close to 30,000 employees.

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The Metropolitan Toronto Council

The Metropolitan Toronto Council consists of 34 councillors elected by residents of Metropolitan Toronto in metropolitan wards. The Chairman is chosen from within Council by the members of Council. Members include eight councillors from the City of Toronto, seven from the City of North York, six from the City of Scarborough, four from the City of Etobicoke, two from the City of York, one from the Borough of East York, and the mayors of the six municipalities.

A number of Standing and Special Committees support the work of Metropolitan Toronto Council.

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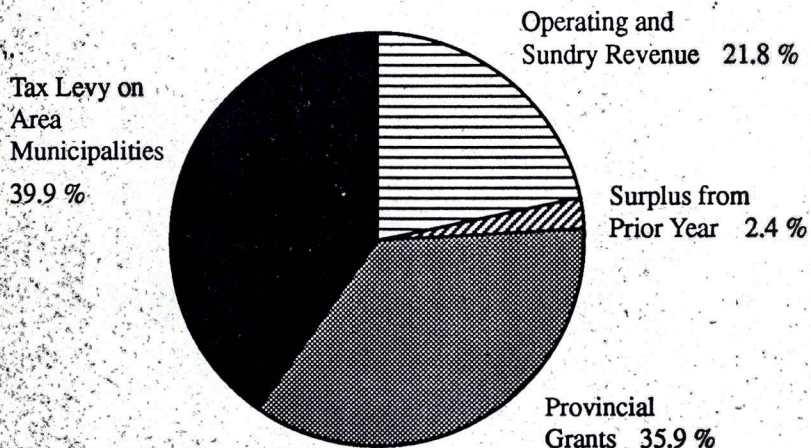

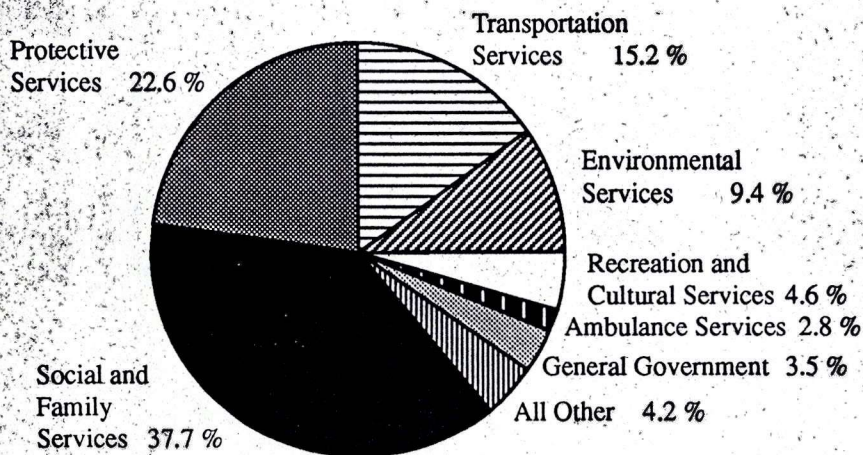

Department Overviews

AMBULANCE SERVICES DEPARTMENT

This department transports the ill and injured, and provides pre-hospital emergency care and paramedic services to all citizens living and working within Metropolitan Toronto.

Ambulance Services is also involved in disaster planning in cooperation with allied emergency services and the Ontario Ministry of Health.

AUDIT DEPARTMENT

Audit staff examine and audit the financial operations of the Metro Corporation, its boards and commissions, and organizations funded by Metro.

CHAIRMAN'S OFFICE

Staff provide services for the Metropolitan Chairman and Council as needed, and help develop policies, goals, priorities and programs. The Economic Development Division plays a major role in creating and retaining jobs for Metro's citizens, and works to ensure Metro's continued economic growth.

CLERK'S DEPARTMENT

The Metropolitan Clerk records the resolutions, decisions and other proceedings of the Metropolitan Council, and keeps the originals of all by-laws and Council/Committee minutes. The Department also coordinates Metro's official functions, and maintains a records centre and archives.

CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER'S DEPARTMENT

This department oversees the administrative effectiveness and efficiency of the Corporation. Areas of responsibility include: the corporate budget process; economic and policy research; program reviews; liaison with departments, agencies, boards and commissions on budget and administrative matters; organizational reviews and policy analysis; and programs and policies in the areas of cultural services, multiculturalism and race relations, information and communications, and the corporate environmental secretariat.

COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT

This department provides a wide range of programs and services to meet Metropolitan Toronto's complex social needs. Through its operating divisions and units, the Department provides child care, homes for the aged, social assistance, housing, emergency hostel accommodations and other special services including policy, planning and community development.

LEGAL DEPARTMENT

Staff provide legal services to Metro Council and its committees, all Metro departments, and to various local boards and special purpose agencies. Solicitors are involved in litigation at all levels in the courts, as well as administrative tribunals.

Agencies, Boards and Commissions

Metropolitan Toronto oversees and funds a variety of agencies, boards, and commissions. Each makes a major contribution to the quality of life in Metro.

EXHIBITION PLACE

Exhibition Place, with its historical buildings, covers 140 hectares on the shore of Lake Ontario and hosts a wide variety of trade, industrial and consumer shows, as well as agricultural, theatrical, musical and other events. It is home to the world's largest annual fair, the Canadian National Exhibition.

THE GUILD

The Guild is known as a unique museum of historical architecture and sculpture, and as a site for conferences and seminars. The Metropolitan Council has leased The Guild's hotel operations to a hotel operator.

LICENSING COMMISSION

The Licensing Commission regulates businesses throughout Metro, ranging from the taxicab industry to bakery shops. The Commission monitors these businesses to ensure they conform to licensing by-laws.

METROPOLITAN TORONTO CONVENTION AND VISITORS ASSOCIATION

This association markets Metropolitan Toronto as a year-round destination for travel, as well as an inviting site for conventions and conferences.

METROPOLITAN TORONTO LIBRARY BOARD

The Library Board operates the Metropolitan Toronto Reference Library. This library offers staff expertise, reference and research collections and services to meet the information needs of the public. The library is known as a centre of unique specialized resources, and is often asked to provide information that is not readily available in public, school, or special libraries. The Metro Reference Library is one of the finest resource centres in all of Canada.

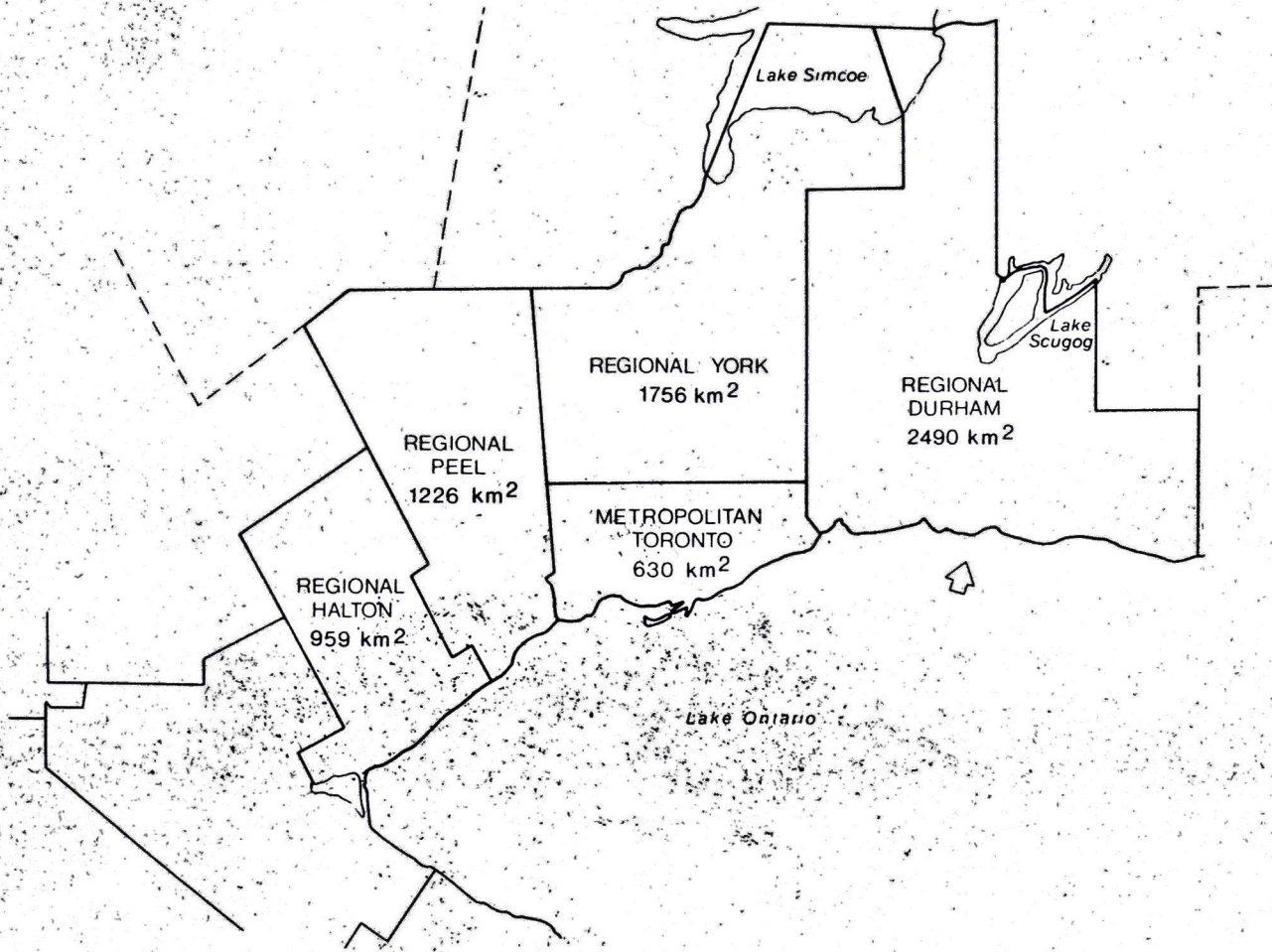
