MINUTES OF COMMITTEE III, LAND USE, RECREATIONAL & CULTURAL ACTIVITIES MEETING

Held: June 29, 1976

MEMBERS PRESENT: Chairman Gisvold; Vice Chairman Herrell; Bullier, Jaeger, Kirkpatrick, Lang, Moshofsky, Stevenson

STAFF: Martin, Kelly, McCarthy, Kenny, Stamm

Chairman Gisvold called the meeting to order, and Ken Martin presented revised charts on Libraries, Parks and Recreation which were discussed by the committee. The five major headings were not listed by priority, but were suggested by the librarian resource people who had spoken at a previous meeting. Herrell commented that libraries should be at the upper level rather than at the city or county level; he thinks that it would be a mistake to add another level without performing any useful function.

Gisvold thought coordination, acquisitions, technical processes and cataloguing could be put into an upper tier.

Herrell pointed out that Multnomah county says they cannot afford the services - that they might be glad to be relieved of the libraries. Gisvold did not agree, and in a two-tier model, he would vote to keep the status quo. Kirkpatrick does not favor complete regionalization of libraries.

These charts will be sent out to the resource librarians and a state librarian for their comments, and will be accompanied with a cover memo stressing the fact that they are strictly for discussion and not a finished project. There was considerable comment about the state's activity in libraries. Some committee members did not think that it should be involved, but others pointed out that the librarians themselves had expressed strong feelings for some state funding.

There was discussion over the word "coordination" which Martin said meant planning, something the librarians had stated a need for.

The staff will prepare the charts and narrative for presentation at the next meeting.

Parks and Recreation: Some were concerned that another tier was being created for which another staff would be needed. Martin said the staff might be the same; the real difference was whether or not it should be financed by everyone in the area rather than just by the people that use it. Gisvold cited the Zoo as an example of carrying over staff when the governing body had been changed. In discussing parks, Gisvold said that those that weren't economically successful could be taken care of in a broader base.

Some terms, such as "regional", "major", "standard setting", "coordination" and their meanings were discussed for substitution or improvement.

The staff will bring revised charts and narrative to the next meeting on this subject.

Judith Kenny presented a document for information on land use planning.

Next week's meeting will cover the cultural activities and facilities aspects of planning.

Meeting was adjourned at 1:32 p.m.
