Northwest Natural requested an easement on Metro open space property along the Tualatin River for an underground natural gas pipeline.

Among the initial steps in updating the Metropolitan Greenspaces Master Plan is the revision of the Greenspaces Regional System Concept Map. After completing a parks and greenspaces inventory and undergoing a technical review to identify the components of the regional system, a draft concept map is available for review and approval.

Jeff Tucker (Parks Finance Manager) will review the budget planning process for FY 03-04 and discuss identified issues and policies related to the budget.

<u>Subject</u>: NW Natural has applied for a permanent utility easement through Metro owned property at River Road and Farmington Road, near the Tualatin River. The permanent easement would allow them to construct and maintain a section of a sub-surface 24-inch diameter steel natural gas transmission pipeline on property known as the Schmidt and Bogden properties.

<u>Summary:</u> NW Natural is proposing the pipeline to effectively utilize gas storage capacity at its underground natural gas storage facility located near Mist in northwest Oregon. The transmission line will be approximately 60 miles long; as it will end in Molalla.

On the Metro owned property the proposed pipeline will be bored underground at a depth of 60 feet below the surface. There will be no surface grading nor soil fill or removal associated with the installation of this section of the pipeline. Above ground warning markers will be installed adjacent to the Metro property.

NW Natural's route of preference was along a public right of way and over the Farmington Road Bridge. ODOT advised them that due to excessive loading to the wood structure that placement of the line on the bridge would not be permitted.

NW Natural will pay staff costs for processing the request and \$9,771. that represents 50% of the appraised value of the area within the easement and is the appropriate amount when only an easement is requested. The appraisal was completed by PGP Valuation Inc.

Recommendation: NW Natural has submitted an application for easement by providing the information per resolution 97-2539B "For The Purpose Of Approving General Policies Related To The Review Of Easements, Right-Of-Ways, And Leases For Non-Park Uses Through Properties Managed By Regional Parks And Greenspaces Department." The application was reviewed and found to have no impact on Metro owned property. Staff recommendation is to approve the permanent easement as requested.

### FY 2003-04 Budget Assumptions

- Interest Earnings Rate 2%
- Inflation / Cost of Living 2%
- Fringe Benefits (Health, Dental, Payroll taxes, etc.) between 39.75% and 43.0%, depending on division
- Transfers for Central Services (HR, Accounting, Legal, etc.) approximately 23% of Operating Expenses

### **Policy Assumptions**

- \$1 per ton continues through FY2003-04 as planned
- Continue to use financial reserves (fund balance) to balance the budget
- Open Spaces program winds down only 2 FTE in FY03-04
- Regional Parks Funds provides financial support to the Smith & Bybee Lakes Fund
- Council approves proposal to add surcharge to cemetery grave sales; create Perpetual Care Fund
- Receive financial support from partners to pay for Cooper Mountain Master Plan
- Other programs do not grow or shrink

### Add/Cut Packages

- Cut #1 Identifies cuts to be made if the Department did not use financial reserves (fund balance) to balance its FY 03-04 budget
- Cut #2 Identifies cuts to be made if the Department used the same amount of financial reserves to balance FY04 as it did in FY03
