Clint reviewed minimal change Scenarios A, B, C, D and introduced Scenarios E, F, G. These maps consider feedback from APANO and address unifying Aloha, addressing 82nd, and completing Happy Valley.

Councilor Gonzalez recounted a meeting with Councilor Rosenthal & the Mayor of Beaverton where the Mayor requested Beaverton remain together.

Councilor Lewis noted that APANO was the most vocal, and that one of the maps that address all their concerns should be among those that are brought to Council.

Scenario A	Councilor Gonzalez: Disagrees with the D4 → D5 change. Area feels more “SW Portland”.

Scenario D	Councilor Lewis: Negative for her region; however, it addresses the concerns raised by APANO. Councilor Craddick: Makes sense from a transportation perspective; don’t know whether Clackamas County should belong to one councilor.
Scenario E	Clint: Unifies Aloha, doesn’t make drastic changes to District 2.

Scenario G	Councilor Lewis suggested bringing this scenario to show that they’d considered (ie: not necessarily endorsing it, but “showing the work”)
Rejected Scenario (Scenario D Alt 2): D5 and D6 oriented along MLK.	Tom Kloster noted that this would break up a historically Black area and could be problematic from a planning perspective, as well as sending a message by even presenting it.
