

Redistricting Subcommittee Meeting

9:00 AM Friday, November 12, 2021 on Zoom

Present: Shirley Craddick (she/her), Juan Carlos Gonzalez (he/him), Christine Lewis (she/her), Anne Buzzini (she/her), Clint Chiavarini (he/him), Ina Zucker (she/her), Connor Ayers (he/him)

Councilor Craddick recommended taking Mayor Bubeniks comments from the public hearing on November 09 into consideration. He asked for Tualatin to not be split between districts.

Councilor Gonzalez appreciated the feedback from the Mayor but noted that I5 seems like a good it would make a natural border.

Councilor Lewis noted that Tualatin is in two counties, which is the larger disruption.

Councilor Craddick also brought attention to comments from Arrthew Ng during the November 10 public hearing.

Anne shared a presentation showing how much support each scenario got from public testimony.

Clint shared a map that combined considerations from public comment with previous scenarios.

Councilor Gonzalez asked for clarification on comments received from Kathryn Harrington. She had recommended including more of Washington County in Metro District 5.

Councilors discussed the scenario that combined previous scenarios with input from public comments and any other issues it resulted in.

Councilors Craddick and Lewis expressed support for scenarios A1 and A2.

Councilor Lewis asked if the scenarios could be modified to unify the Parkrose School District.

Clint discussed possible ways that Parkrose could be unified.

Ina noted that school districts hadn't generally come to metro with issues that specifically affected them.

Anne noted that despite A2 being favored by councilors, it was the least popular among public testimony. A1 was more popular.

Councilor Gonzalez reminded the others that less than 50 comments had been received from a region of over a million people, so they may not be an accurate sample.

Councilor Lewis noted that while A1 was popular with written testimony, it was less popular with those who attended public hearings.

Councilor Gonzalez expressed support for bringing scenario A1 as the preferred scenario to the rest of the Council

Councilor Craddick noted that no matter what Tualatin will be in multiple districts.

A1 was decided as the preferred scenario with A2 as an alternative.
