## MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN SERVICE DISTRICT

SPECIAL MEETING February 13, 1984

Councilors Present: Councilors Banzer, Bonner, Deines, Btlinger, Hansen, Kafoury, Kelley, Kirkpatrick, Van Bergen, and Waker.

Councilors Absent: Councilors Oleson and Williamson.

Also Present: Rick Gustafson, Executive Officer.

Staff Present: Donald Carlson, Warren Iliff, Ray Barker, Andrew Jordan, Jennifer Sims, and Kay Rich.

A special meeting of the Council of the Metropolitan Service District was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Presiding Officer Kirkpatrick for the purpose of considering adoption of Ordinance No. 84-169 and Resolution No. 84-449.

## 1. Consideration of Ordinance No. 84-169, for the purpose of submitting Metropolitan Service District Zoo Serial Levy. (Second Reading)

Councilor Bonner reported on the Council Coordinating Committee's recommendation for Council adoption of the ordinance with the following amendments:

- To delete the words "for the health and welfare of District residents by providing" in Section 4.A Purpose. The amended would read as follows: "To provide for the maintenance and operation of the Zoo, and for the construction and renovation of Zoo exhibits."
- 2) To amend the Insert A (Revised Ballot Title recommended by staff and adopted by the Committee) to change the word "Metro" to "the District" in the first sentence.

Donald Carlson, Deputy Executive Officer, pointed out that staff had recommended other changes to the ordinance, which were also approved by the Council Coordinating Committee, as follows:

 Section 6.B. -- change the filing date with the Director of Records and Elections of Multnomah County from March 15 to February 14, 1984. Special Council Meeting February 13, 1984 Page 2

- Section 7. -- change the filing date with the Multnomah County Tax Supervising & Conservation Commission from March 9 to February 14, 1984.
- 3) To add a new Section 8 to set a filing date with the Secretary of State of March 6 to meet publication requirements for the Voters' Pamphlet.

The ordinance was then read a second time, by title only.

There was no public testimony.

Councilor Van Bergen stated that he disagreed with the Coordinating Committee's deletion of the words "for the health and welfare". Presiding Officer Kirkpatrick stated that the Legal Counsel had indicated that the language was not required in the ordinance.

Councilor Etlinger suggested that in the Ballot Title Explanation the \$2,000,000 indicated for construction should also mention repair or replacement of existing exhibits. He also said the change in the first sentence to "the District" should be expanded to "the Metro District" to identify Metro as the operator of the Zoo.

There was then discussion of the use of capital funds for new and replacement construction. Councilor Bonner said the emphasis of the Ballot Title should be away from new construction and toward repair and replacement, where the bulk of the funding would go. Councilor Kelley agreed with Councilor Bonner's remarks.

Councilor Waker asked what would be submitted for the Voters' Pamphlet. Mr. Carlson responded that the Ballot Title and Ordinance would be submitted for inclusion, as it was for the 1980 election.

Councilor Etlinger seconded<br/>the motion.

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Nays: Councilor Van Bergen.

Absent: Councilors Banzer, Oleson, and Williamson.

Notion to amend carried.

Councilor Bonner said that if the whole ordinance was going to be printed in the Voters' Pamphlet that perhaps the Purpose section of the ordinance should be strengthened (Section 4).

Councilor Hansen seconded the motion.

Councilor Van Bergen argued against the amendment and stressed that the recreation and education statements were properly placed in the Findings section of the ordinance.

- <u>Vote:</u> The vote on the motion to call for the question carried unanimously by voice vote.
- <u>Vote:</u> The vote on the motion to amend the language in Section 4.A. resulted in:
  - Ayes: Councilors Bonner and Etlinger.
  - Nays: Councilors Hansen, Kafoury, Kelley, Kirkpatrick, Van Bergen, and Waker.
  - Absent: Councilors Banzer, Deines, Oleson, and Williamson.

Notion failed.

- Vote: The vote on the main motion to adopt Ordinance No. 84-169, made by Councilors Etlinger and Deines on February 2, 1984, as amended, resulted in:
  - Ayes: Councilors Bonner, Etlinger, Hansen, Kafoury, Kelley, Kirkpatrick, Van Bergen, and Waker.

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Nays: None.

Absent: Councilors Banzer, Deines, Oleson, and Williamson.

Notion carried, Ordinance adopted as amended.

## 2. Consideration of Resolution No. 84-449, for the purpose of authorizing a new classification of Maintenance Foreman.

Councilor Bonner reported that the Council Coordinating Committee recommended adoption of the Resolution with a staff recommended amendment to add that the salary range for the Maintenance Foreman classification shall be 10.

- Motion: 84-449, as recommended by the Council Coordinating Committee. Councilor Waker seconded the motion.
