3. Monitoring Vegetation Management and Weed Control
  - a. Regular Site inspections
    - i. Identifying and documenting what grows when and where – grasses, forbs, weeds, natives and non-natives
    - ii. Establish photo points on the landfill that we can use to document progress. Where and how often?
  - b. Evaluating weeds and invasives and how to manage them.
    - i. Do we attack all weeds in one sub area at a time?
    - ii. Do we attack the most noxious weeds over the entire landfill?
  - c. Establishing or encouraging natives.
    - i. Proposals that come from the plan
    - ii. Other ways such as planting native grasses and forbs anytime we disturb areas with construction projects or weed removal.
