Subject: Smith/Bybee Lakes

Hi Emily,

Mary Anne Sohlstrom wrote to me that you were asking about my progress on the Smith and Bybee Lakes dragonfly list. I only got out there a couple times during the fall last year, so the list is rather incomplete (I assume), but here is what I recorded:

ZYGOPTERA (damselflies)

Coenagrionidae (pond damsels)

Enallagma carunculatum	(tule bluet)
Ischnura cervula	(Pacific forktail)

ANISOPTERA (dragonflies)

Aeshnidae (darners)

Aeshna californica	(California darner)
Aeshna multicolor	(blue-eyed darner)
Aeshna umbrosa	(shadow darner)
Anax junius	(common green darner)

Libellulidae (skimmers)

Libellula forensis	(eight-spotted skimmer)
Libellula luctuosa	(widow skimmer)
Libellula lydia	(common whitetail)
Sympetrum pallipes	(striped meadowhawk)
Tramea lacerata	(black saddlebags)

I haven't been out there at all this year since the permit you granted me was valid for 1997 only, and I have been distracted by a lot of other neat places.

There are no doubt additional species flying right now (*Lestes congener*, *Ischnura perparva*, *Aeshna palmata*, *Sympetrum vicinum*, *Erythemis collocata*, *Pachydiplax longipennis*; maybe *Stylurus olivaceus*).

I may ask for another collecting permit next year, if that's OK with you - unless I can collect this fall.
