Lack of St. Johns Neighborhood Association Representation

At the March 30 meeting of the Smith and Bybee Lakes Management Committee, Emily Roth refused to allow the St. Johns Neighborhood Association's representative to fill the vacancy on the Committee. This refusal was shocking and disappointing. In two separate, prior conversations, Ms. Roth told two St. Johns residents that our Neighborhood Association had an empty seat on the Committee. Our Association therepon appointed a representative to fill that seat.

To justify this action, Ms. Roth referred to Policy 5 in the Management Plan for Smith & Bybee Lakes, which describes the makeup of the Committee (pages 50-51). We believe Ms. Roth's interpretation of this Policy is mistaken. We also believe that she is not authorized to form this Committee. Policy 5 states that the Trust Fund Manager shall form the Committee and that "the Committee will include but not be limited to" the twelve groups listed. Only one representative on the list is drawn from the community, described as the "President of Peninsula Neighbors." Peninsula Neighbors is actually the North Portland Citizens Committee, which is very alive and well. Nevertheless, the local community has not had any representation on this Committee for many years. This is unacceptable. In fact, this Committee should have several citizens from the local community on it.

As the Trust Fund Manager, Metro has the authority to form this Committee. The St. Johns Neighborhood Association requests the Metro Council to immediately fill this vacancy with our representative. This request is especially valid because Smith & Bybee Lakes and the St. Johns Landfill are located completely within our Association's boundaries. Thank you.

In early April, you contacted our office in regard to a vacancy on the Smith and Bybee Management Committee. Metro, like many organizations working in North Portland at that time reserved a position on the committee for the contractor of neighborhood services in North Portland at the time, Peninsula Neighbors. Peninsula Neighbors no longer has the contract to provide neighborhood services. Those services are now provided directly through the Office of Neighborhood Involvement.

You asked me to consider how that position might be filled now that services had shifted from the now defunct Peninsula neighbors. I suggested that the chairs of the neighborhood associations for the nine neighborhoods currently in the North Portland District (eight of who formerly comprised Peninsula Neighbors) be approached. At the April chairs meeting, the chairs elected to develop a process to advertise, consider, and create a recommendation to Metro to fill this position. The chairs directed our office to create a process of getting the word to commence in May. The chairs will review the applications and then nominate a committee member to Metro.

I anticipate having a recommendation to Metro by mid-June.

As outlined in my memo to you of April 26, 1999, the North Portland Neighborhood Chairs sought community nominations for a position vacancy on the Metro Smith and Bybee Lakes Management Committee. The process involved advertising the position through an article in *Neighbors Between the Rivers* (with a circulation of 19,000 and delivered free of charge to all households on the North Portland Peninsula) as well as through discussions at neighborhood association meetings. Three applications were received. The chairs reviewed the applications after the applicant's name and address had been removed.

The chairs of the North Portland Neighborhoods ranked the three candidates and chose to nominate Lance Bailey for consideration by Metro for this position. All candidates received high praise.

Although as a chair she agreed to the process of selecting the candidates, the St Johns Neighborhood Association chair remained neutral in their ranking. SJNA submitted a letter requesting that Metro consider creating a position on the Smith and Bybee Management Committee be held for a member of their association.
