Health Risk Assessment at Smith and Bybee Lakes

In the draft St. Johns Landfill Closure Water Monitoring Plan submitted to DEQ in March 1991, we proposed to analyze fish tissue from specimens taken from Smith and Bybee Lakes. The objective was to assess the health risk associated with consuming fish from the lakes. We proposed to obtain a number of specimens of three species that are commonly angled and consumed and that represent different links in the food chain (i.e. bottom feeders, upper water grazers, predators). We are to collect a number of each specie throughout the lakes during the June electro-fishing survey, then composite the edible tissue of each species for analysis. This is a limited but cost-effective method for assessing health risk to consumers. At this time, we have scheduled to sample fish tissue only once.

Staff from U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is scheduled to conduct their electro-fishing survey in the lakes June 22-24. We must be prepared to submit fish tissue for analysis to a Metro-contracted lab by that time. Solid Waste Department currently has a contract with Columbia Analytical Services. To expedite the process, I urge that we submit these samples to this lab under the existing contract. Cost estimates for analyzing the fish tissue is given below.

5. Methods. Where applicable, CAS will use analytical methodologies which are in substantial conformity with U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), State Agency, American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM), Association of Official Analytical Chemists (AOAC). Standard Methods for the Examination or vialed and Westernature, or other recognized methodologies. CAS reserves the right to deviate from these methodologies, if necessary or appropriate, due to the nature or composition of the sample or otherwise, based on the reasonable judgment of CAS.
