Backyard Wildlife Sanctuary Education Program Metro Greenspaces Grant Program

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The purpose of the project is to develop and implement a comprehensive education program to educate and encourage citizens in Clark County to develop and maintain a Backyard Wildlife habitat. The education program augments the Wildlife Demonstration Gardens.

The Backyard Wildlife Sanctuary (BWS) Education program is comprised of two main components: Education and Publicity/Outreach.

The educational component is based on and emphasizes landscaping for wildlife with native plants. The curriculum includes but not limited to feeding sources, housing, water sources, efficient use of water, herbicide and pesticide education. Additional wildlife attracting concepts such as brush piles, nurse logs, etc. are taught also.

The landscaping handout material emphasizes the same concepts seen and experienced in our nearby greenspaces - that of plant layering, plant diversity, edge maximization and native plants all applied in a residential setting.

The program employs an multi-faceted outreach component. Classes will be offered through diverse channels such as Vancouver's Parks and Recreation Department, the Community Education System, Neighborhood Associations, Civic Organizations, Friends Groups, and Conservation Organizations to ensure the message is disseminated to a broad spectrum of individuals. The BWS Program also has displays/exhibits at public events throughout the year.

II. GOALS AND BENEFITS OF PROJECT:

The primary long term goal of the project was to increase the publics awareness of the loss of wildlife habitat and how they, in their own yards, could provide habitat by creating their own Backyard Wildlife Habitat Sanctuary. The program works in combination with the Wildlife Demonstration Gardens showing first hand how to landscape for wildlife and the plants that attract wildlife.

IV. PROJECT STAFF/ VOLUNTEERS:

This project was wholly completed by volunteers, including curriculum planning, budgeting, and teaching with supervision by Vancouver Parks & Recreation Department.

Dan George was project manager with Jeff Wittler as the Volunteer Project Manager. The project included over 25 different volunteers in excess of 1500 hours (these are supported by our volunteer log sheets - see attached schedule). These volunteers came from many different groups including NatureScaping, Master Gardeners, Sierra Club, Audubon.

V. HOW THE PROJECT RELATES TO THE GREENSPACES PROGRAM:

This project is consistent with the objectives of the Greenspaces program by: Restoring or creating wildlife habitat in the urban area that will provide wildlife habitat and serve as a potential site for education and interpretation; Increasing the public's awareness of the importance of diversity in wildlife habitat; Using volunteers in project implementation; The use of native plants in the design of the project; And by providing an easily accessible site for wildlife viewing and enjoyment.

VI. WHAT WORKED/ WHAT DIDN'T/ HELPFUL HINTS:

The original plan was to have both adult and school age education. The adult education part has been very successful. The program has reached thousands of homeowners.

The school age portion did not every really materialize primarily due to the individual committed to this portion has had many family problems and was unable to proceed. The program has made several presentations to school age students but not to the extent originally hoped. We still hope to get this portion going in the future.

As for the program as a whole we have met most of our goals & objectives and the program is still growing. With the finishing of the Wildlife Demonstration Gardens the program will reach even more homeowners in the years to come.

at Home & Garden Fairs & other Public Events

One of the unplanned and unanticipated avenues of public outreach were Home & Garden Shows and other public events. Organizers of these events were very generous by donating the use of booth space at their events. Without the donation of space we would not have been able to have a presence at these shows. We distributed between 10,000 & 14,000 "Creating A Backyard Wildlife Habitat" brochures at these events alone. In addition, we made thousands of personal contacts.

Recently, O'Loughlin Trade Shows, promoters of the one of the largest Home & Garden Shows in the Pacific Northwest, has committed to donating a 20' × 20' booth size in the prime garden display area on a yearly basis. The booth space, worth \$2380 each show, will allow our program to put up a full scale display garden promoting the development of Backyard Wildlife Habitats. This is a very exciting opportunity to bring landscaping for wildlife into mainstream landscaping. This added visability coupled with the Wildlife Demonstration Gardens will allow us to reach thousands of homeowners each year and hopefully have a significant & far reaching impact on the development of urban wildlife habitat.
