The meeting centered around the assigning of additional names from the prospect list gleaned from contributors to the Friends of Metro campaign last fall. There are approximately 120 names on this list.

The following plan for soliciting these prospects was approved:

- 1. A letter will be drafted and sent to committee members for comment and/or approval;
- 2. This letter will be word processed, then sent to the committee member making the personal contact along with a membership application card and return envelope;
- 3. The committee member will enclose a personal note and mail the letters (they will be stamped):
- 4. If there has been no response within an appropriate length of time (10 days?), the prospect will be called about making a contribution (dues).
- 5. The letters will be hand-signed by Wanda and Bob;
- 6. Letters will be sent from the office to those persons not assigned to a committee member. Follow-up on those names will be discussed at a later date.

Copies of proposed thank you letters and a follow-up letter to persons who make pledges were circulated and approved.

Wanda announced that Sue would be helping the Finance Committee for six weeks. During this time she will organize the files, assist in preparing the materials for the mailing and help develop a finance plan.

\$1875 has been contributed from the prospect list thus far as a result of the original membership mailing and personal solicitations. There are also 4 pledges totaling \$1550.

The prospect list will be mailed to those committee members not present. Wanda will go over the list with them to assign more names.

- 4. You will mail the letters and follow up with personal phone calls within ten days if there is no response. Wanda and I will keep records and notify you if a membership is mailed in.

We have a list of over 100 names. The Finance Committee has taken about half for personal contacts. We will send the rest a letter, card and return envelope. We can discuss whether to follow-up on any of these at a later date.


During the summer we will work on expanding the prospect list. A decision will need to be made on those names also at a later date.


