Earl Blumenauer calls for debates on many issues

By LINDA WILLIAMS of The Oregonian staff

Multnomah County Commissioner Earl Blumenauer Monday accepted a challenge to a series of debates from his opponent in the March 31 runoff election for Portland City Council.

But he proposed that the topics to be covered include more than the three outlined in Margaret Strachan's chal-

He suggested six to eight debates including discussions on land-use planning, transportation, municipal management and budgeting, the arts and education. He said he also was willing to debate the issues of affordable housing, jobs, and safe and secure neighborhoods proposed by Ms. Strachan Thursday.

proposed by Ms. Strachan Thursday.
"Voters deserve a comprehensive look at the candidates. To do that, we need a wider range of issues than just simply the three suggested by my opponent," Blumenauer said at a morning press conference.

"I would also like to see a broader range of organizations and viewpoints represented in putting the debates together. And finally, I think it would be interesting and would increase voter interest if we threw in a wild card question at each of the events," he add-

Blumenauer said the format of the debates should be the traditional debate style, often associated with the 1860 debates between Abraham Lincoln and

Stephen Douglas, instead of a format where the candidates simply respond to questions.

He suggested that at least one of the debates include questions from a panel of media representatives or other persons with some expertise on the topics to be covered.

It appears that both parties have agreed to the debates in principle, Ms. Strachan said in a later interview. She said her staff was scheduled to meet with Blumenauer's staff Tuesday to begin negotiations on debate specifics, including structure and sponsoring organizations.

"I think that it's important that the two groups work these things out so that there will be no misunderstanding later. ... Part of the problem is time," she said

Ms. Strachan said she was willing to debate the additional issues proposed by Blumenauer, but would insist that "neighborhood livability" be included.

Both campaign organizations said they will attempt to negotiate with organizations that already have invited them to joint appearances, including the Portland City Club, to see if they will accept the proposed debate formats.

Both campaign organizations were to meet with the Portland chapter of the League of Women Voters Tuesday to see if the organization would sponsor some of the debates.


