George Van Bergen, District 6 representing Milwaukie, Happy Valley, Boring and areas of Multnomah and Clackamas counties.

Councilor Van Bergen is a lawyer in private practice since 1961, and he graduated from Northwestern College of Law. Previously, he was employed as the Milwaukie city attorney, and administrator of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission. He serves as chairman of Metro's Council Management Committee, and a member of the Joint Policy Advisory Committee on Transportation (JPACT). His community activities have included membership on the board of the North Clackamas Chamber of Commerce, Dwyer Community Hospital, Bank of Milwaukie, Willamette View Manor, and several other boards.

Sharron Kelley, District 7 representing an area including Gresham, Fairview, Troutdale and Orient in southeast Multnomah County.

Councilor Kelley is office manager and salesperson for Larry Kelley's Appliances. She attended Mississippi University and is studying at Mt. Hood Community College. At Metro, she serves on the Tri-Met Special Needs Committee, the Criminal Justice Task Force, the Regional Parks Task Force and the Metro Budget Committee. Her many community activities include Gresham Chamber of Commerce and Eastside Business Alliance, the Rockwood Community Group, and chairperson of the Multnomah County Parks Commission. She is chairperson of the board of the Mt. Hood Community Mental Health Center, and serves on the advisory board of the East County Youth Services Center and on the Private Industry Council.

Hardy Myers, District 9 representing east Portland neighborhoods, including Sunnyside, Mt. Tabor, Lents, Laurelhurst, Foster-Powell and Montavilla.

Councilor Myers served in the Oregon House of Representatives from 1975 to 1984 from District 19. He was elected Speaker of the House in 1979, and consistently received high ratings from local newspaper surveys. Myers is a partner in the law firm of Stoel, Rives, Boley, Fraser and Wyse and is a member of the Oregon State Bar and Multnomah Bar Association. He co-authored a civil liberties handbook for high schools entitled, "Liberty and the Law." Myers received a bachelor's degree from the University of Mississippi and a law degree from the University of Oregon, and serves on the Board of Editors for the Oregon Law Review. At Metro, Myers serves as a special legislative liaison and a member of the Budget Committee.

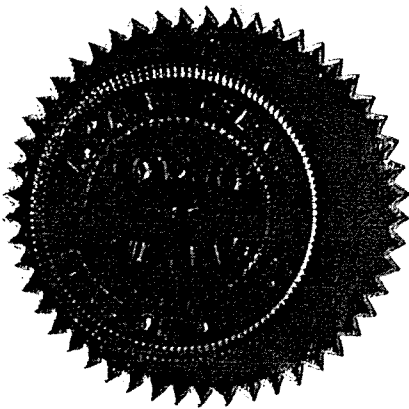

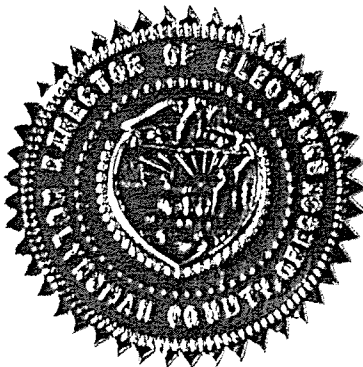
