Dear Mr. Gardner:

My neighborhood assiciation, Interlachen Inc., is in unincorporated Mult. Co., and has been independent for 60 years. We are in one of the most scenic and wildlife habitat areas of east Mult. Co., being situated on two lakes that parallel the Columbia River. One of these lakes, Fairview Lake, is currently being threatened by massive development plans.

Because of the threat of loss of about 140 or more acres of habitat and farm land we have formed a land trust with the help of Jack Broome of Wetlands Conservancy. We have been writing letters, going to meetings, for almost 2 years, and cannot seem to pull enough concerned people together from all the various agencies to help us in preservation.

The City of Fairview wants to put 2 to 3,000 people on the east, south and west ends of the lake in all SIGNIFICANT ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERN identified areas by Mult. Co. in 1980 ORD #234. The City's next step July 30, 1992, is to annex $\frac{1}{2}$ of the BOTTOM of Fairview Lake in order to make it easier for developers to go through one set of permits instead of two. Next, they will change 80% of the SIGNIFICANT ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERN land to their own zoning designations for easier development.

But the ground water contamination problem looms underneath us with even more threat. The large plume of TCE and PCE is migrating from the Boeing, Cascade, Viking and Swift Industries towards our wells in the underground aquifers. This same area is the back-up water supply for the City of Portland, but most likely completely unusable at this time. The City of Fairview is our back-up supply. What if their wells become contaminated?

Perhaps our only hope remains with the Greenspaces Program. The very act of saving our habitat area around Fairview Lake would help to recharge these threatened aquifers. We have very little time left. The City of Fairview is on the march with no one to stop them. Example: last evening they changed the zoning of a site containing 2 Significant Environmental Concern creeks that flow into Fairview Lake, from agricultural to General Manufacturing....we voiced a strong opposition and gave suggestions....they waivered for about 5 minutes, then went ahead and passed the zone change.

Thank you for your article about the Metropolitan Greenspaces program in the Sept. 3 - 9 issue of Willamette Week. As writer Angela Wilson suggests, voters need to decide how important it is to protect vulnerable natural areas throughout the region and whether a bond issue (Measure 26-1) is the appropriate method. We noted some lack of information in the article, however, and would like to set the record straight for potential voters.

Ballot Measure 26-1 gives the people the opportunity to decide if now is the time to save some of the metropolitan area's greenspaces for future generations. As reflected in the public survey you cited in your article, 77 percent of the people believe that the amount of natural areas now in the metropolitan area is adequate. However, your article didn't note that 67 percent believe that the amount 20 years from now will be inadequate. Considering the number of people moving here in the next 20 years (nearly 500,000), the public needs to consider what quality of life they want for their children and their grandchildren.

Currently, only about 8 percent of the greenspaces regionwide are protected through public ownership (a total of 9,000 acres). Half of that total acreage is in Portland's Forest Park. The remaining 92 percent of natural areas are fast disappearing as the region's population grows.

The bond measure would allow purchase of about 7,000 acres of natural areas, wildlife habitat, stream corridors and trails. We are not asking voters at this time to approve funds for operation and maintenance. Since bond funds cannot be used for this purpose, Metro has committed existing funds to hold these lands on an interim basis. In the future, Metro will adopt a new funding source to pay for operation and maintenance costs when the lands are opened up for passive recreation activities.

As for expanding Metro's powers, the legislation (ORS 268) approved by the region's voters in 1978 allows Metro to "acquire, develop, maintain and operate a system of parks, open space and recreational facilities of metropolitan significance." Metro has simply not chosen to exercise this authority until now.

To clarify your article's example of the Peterkort property, Metro's overall objectives are to ensure an adequate transportation system with support for the westside light rail, provide for appropriate development around the transit station and protect some natural areas called for in the Greenspaces Master Plan. All three are desirable uses of this land and are potentially compatible.

Any funds raised by approval of ballot measure 26-1 would be spent on the Oregon side of the metropolitan region. While the Greenspaces program is a two-state effort, its funding and administration are carried out separately on each side of the Columbia River. Clark County will consider the appropriate financing methods to raise funds for Washington greenspaces.

In closing, we want to clarify that the two representatives from Oregon who were the most help in obtaining federal funding for the start-up of the Greenspaces program were Congressman Les AuCoin and Senator Mark Hatfield.

We appreciate your coverage of the Metropolitan Greenspaces program and urge your readers to call Metro at 22-GREEN if they want more information.

One of the major areas of concern dealt with the question of whether ODOT is committed to fund the preferred alternative resulting from the study, regardless of the result, or only a Bypass option. Because of the new direction set in the Oregon Transportation Plan, increased flexibility for funding provided by ISTEA and the importance of completing the EIS in a manner unbiased by funding preferences, this is a significant policy concern. In addition, it has ramifications for other funding concerns throughout the region.

As a member of JPACT, could you please ensure this is addressed by the Oregon Transportation Commission and discussed further at JPACT.

Sandi Hansen District 12 At the August 13, 1992 meeting of JPACT and the September 10, 1992 meeting of the Metro Council, the attached resolutions were adopted relating to elimination of two Western Bypass "Strategies" from further consideration in the "Alternatives" phase of the study. These resolutions include the following provisions.

- 1. The "Western Bypass Option B" is recommended to be dropped for further consideration.
- 2. The "Transit-Intensive" strategy is recommended to be dropped from further consideration. However, there are a number of conditions about the status of LRT as a result of this action:
 - a. Although a "Transit-Intensive" strategy, including LRT, is dropped from further consideration, a combination strategy which includes LRT, support bus services and needed highway projects should be evaluated further before the final alternatives are approved for inclusion in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS). In this manner, a decision can be made as to whether a combination highway/LRT alternative should proceed into the DEIS, a combination highway/bus (with express HOV lanes) alternative should proceed into the DEIS or both.
 - b. All alternatives included in the DEIS should be designed in such a way to not preclude future implementation of LRT. In order to accomplish this, all alternatives approved for inclusion in the DEIS (particularly the non-LRT alternatives) should explicitly identify the intended location for future LRT to ensure future construction is not precluded.

- c. Another LRT alternative may be included in the DEIS through acceptance of the LUTRAQ alternatives for further consideration. If the LUTRAQ study, sponsored by 1000 Friends of Oregon, produces a viable land use/transportation alternative to the Bypass, it will be approved for inclusion in the DEIS. The LUTRAQ alternative and the other Bypass alternatives should be considered for approval for inclusion in the DEIS as a single consolidated action. If necessary, approval of the Bypass alternatives for inclusion in the DEIS should be delayed until the LUTRAQ alternative can also be considered.
- d. LRT is not being dropped from the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) as a possible improvement in the Highway 217 Corridor. If a decision is made that LRT is not a viable component of the solution to the Western circumferential travel problem intended to be addressed by the Western Bypass, it will be retained in the RTP for other purposes.

In addition to action on these two "Strategies," we have concern about ODOT's commitment to fund the preferred alternative resulting from this process. If alternatives to a Bypass are evaluated in the DEIS, then the preferred alternative resulting from this process should be funded. The decision-making process should not be biased by the prospect of securing an Access Oregon funding commitment for the Bypass alternative while leaving the funding prospect for the other alternatives uncertain. This is particularly true under the flexibility provisions now available through ISTEA. Before the alternatives are approved for inclusion in the DEIS, we need to know the intent of the Oregon Transportation Commission on this matter.

I was disappointed to learn that there might be a dispute about the governance and control of the funds. As I'm sure you remember, we worked very hard to design a system to handle these arrangements when we planned the operation of the Convention Center. If the project is going to be funded regionally, it must be governed regionally with Metro having at least the fiscal oversight. Appointment of a subsidiary commission responsible to the Metro Council is one way to accomplish this.

The funding package for the construction and operation of the Convention Center was complex and took considerable negotiation. It also took advocacy from the entire region. Remember Bud Clark's commitment and time he spent on the circuit? And the money raised by business for the election? This process was to be a model for future regional projects and I'll be very disappointed if you have to start from ground zero with each new request.

New Metro citizen involvement committee named

The Metropolitan Service District has selected members and alternates from around the region to serve on the agency's first Committee for Citizen Involvement.

The Metro Council selected the second-round phase of membership during its Nov. 12 council meeting. The first round of members and alternates was completed in August.

The committee consists of 19 members and 19 alternates, although there are a few remaining vacancies that will be filled as committee work progresses and additional citizens express an interest in serving. Some of you may be wondering, "What's this now, some sly attempt to change my vote for P.O.?"

No, it is not.

For better or worse, most of the council has settled in to supporting either me or Judy, and there's little (short of outright bribery) that's going to change those positions.

I just wanted to let everyone know that the unresolved P.O. issue, while adding a level of uncertainty to many things, is not preventing work from going forward on the "organizing" of the council for next year. You have already gotten a questionnaire about council committee preferences. I plan to use that information to try to create committees that function smoothly, contain a cross-section of viewpoints reflecting the council as a whole, and wherever possible follow the preferences you expressed.

I hope Judy will avail herself of the same information, for the same purposes, so the council can be ready to go in January regardless of who is P.O.

We have many far more important details to work out related to implementing the Metro charter, so the choice for P.O. seems almost trivial in comparison. I do not consider it so. You may notice, though, that I am not devoting large amounts of time speaking to each of you about the P.O. race. This is due to the many other issues and discussions that relentlessly go on, that don't suddenly go on "hold" while we make up our collective mind about who will be P.O. So I'm taking this approach to let all of you know: I want to continue as P.O. next year because of what I might be able to help do, not what I'll be or what I'll be paid. For those same reasons, I'm not spending a lot of time now on lobbying for your support. It doesn't mean I don't want your support — I both want and need it. But I'm not going to neglect the real business of the council and of Metro in that quest.

Dear Dick:

I'm pleased the Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources is wasting no time in reviewing the recommendations of the Governor's Task Force on Vehicle Emissions Reduction. I'm confident your committee will conclude, as did we on the Governor's Task Force, that these recommendations represent a careful and responsible approach to maintaining air quality in the Portland metropolitan area.

As the Task Force completed its work this past year, one fact kept standing out: There is no real alternative but to meet the new Clean Air Act requirements. Nonattainment of air quality standards brings consequences which are far worse for the region's economic health than any of the measures being recommended to keep us in attainment. I hope the Legislature keeps this ever in mind as you discuss this issue and, I'm sure, receive testimony about the individual and collective economic impact of the recommendations.

I regret I won't be able to attend your discussion on December 14 due to another obligation. The Governor's Task Force recommendations have my full support and you'll surely see me in front of you as an advocate on future occasions. During the Task Force's deliberations I supported a number of other measures, such as fees on employer-provided parking, that could have even greater benefits for air quality than the final package of recommendations. Please call on me if you or your committee would like to hear about some of these other approaches. This might help frame the context from which emerged the moderate, consensus-based recommendations of the Task Force.

I noticed a few days ago that the EPA released a new list of nonattainment areas and the only Oregon listing was a part of Lane County. While I'd prefer not to see Oregon on the list at all, this is confirmation of the great air quality improvement the Portland metro area has made over the last few years. But rapid growth, especially in the auto-dependent suburban areas, could undo all our efforts unless we take some new approaches to the problem. The Governor's Task Force recommendations are a good start. Again, my thanks for getting to work quickly on this important issue.
