Noel shared a presentation about TDM that included definitions, the RTO Strategy History. 27:00 New TDM Policies were shared from the 2023 RTP.



Public and private sector organizations dedicated to providing a better journey for everyone use TDM programs to provide people with transportation options that help them travel in affordable, efficient and sustainable ways. Different types of TDM programs include commuter transportation benefit programs, Safe Routes to School efforts and community-led encouragement/education events and activities.

- Moving Themes into The Framework


- Vison, Values, Goals
