WHEREAS, The Environmental Protection Agency has approved funding for a car-sharing feasibility study and demonstration project; and

WHEREAS, The Oregon Department of Environmental Quality will administer the grant to evaluate the feasibility of a car sharing demonstration project in the Portland Area; and

WHEREAS, The Environmental Protection Agency will provide \$58,650 for the feasibility study and demonstration project; and

WHEREAS, The Oregon Department of Energy, the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality and Metro will each contribute to the study; and

WHEREAS, The Metro Council has reviewed and considered the need to transfer appropriations within the FY 1996-97 Budget; and

WHEREAS, The need for a transfer of appropriation has been justified; and WHEREAS, Adequate funds exist for other identified needs; now, therefore, THE METRO COUNCIL ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS;

1. That the FY 1996-97 Budget and Schedule of Appropriations are hereby amended as shown in the column titled "Revision" of Exhibits A and B to this Ordinance for the purposes of transferring \$5,000 from Planning Fund contingency to materials & services in the Transportation Department to provide Metro's contribution to the carsharing feasibility study and demonstration project.

This Ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the 2. public health, safety or welfare of the Metro area in order to meet obligations and comply with Oregon Budget Law, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Ordinance takes effect upon passage.

STAFF REPORT

CONSIDERATION OF ORDINANCE NO. 96-669 AMENDING THE FY 1996-97 BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS SCHEDULE FOR THE PURPOSE OF TRANSFERRING \$5,000 FROM THE PLANNING FUND CONTINGENCY TO MATERIALS AND SERVICES TO PROVIDE A METRO CONTRIBUTION TO A REGIONAL CAR-SHARING FEASIBILITY STUDY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

PROPOSED ACTION

This action amends the Transportation Department budget by transferring \$5,000 from Contingency to Materials and Services to provide a Metro contribution to a Regional Car-Sharing Feasibility Study.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has approved funding through their "Market Based Incentive Program" for a Car-Sharing Feasibility Study and demonstration project. A car sharing organization consists of a group of individuals who share a fleet of cars. The vehicle purchase or lease agreement, maintenance, insurance, and repair costs are assumed by the organization. Car sharing allows an individual to have the benefits of auto use, when needed, without the high fixed costs of car ownership (insurance, depreciation, parking etc.). Generally, members are able to reserve a car 24 hours a day and be able to walk to the fleet location.

Car sharing programs are primarily successful in higher density residential areas. The purpose of this study and demonstration project would, in part, identify options to car ownership that would result in reductions of vehicle miles of travel. Car sharing is also seen as an option for those who choose to live in higher density, transit oriented areas, but who may have only an occasional need for a car. Car sharing is seen as an option for promoting alternative transportation consistent with density objectives contained in the Region 2040 Concept and transportation demand management objectives contained within the Regional Transportation Plan.

Car sharing programs are in operation in Europe and Canada. Programs range in size from 5,000 members and 300 vehicles in Switzerland, to a 50 member and 6 vehicle organization in Canada. Evaluation of existing car share programs show a decrease in personal vehicle miles of travel.

For the Portland area, the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) will administer a \$66,650 grant to evaluate the feasibility of a car sharing demonstration project in the Portland area. If determined to be feasible, a private operator will be pursued to assist in a pilot demonstration project. The demonstration project will include \$43,000 of the grant money. The feasibility study will utilize the remaining funds. EPA has made available \$58,650 for the feasibility study and demonstration project. Metro (contributing \$5,000) and the Oregon Department of Energy (contributing \$3,000) will provide the remaining funds. DEQ's grant administration and project management is their contribution to the study.
