THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN SERVICE DISTRICT HEREBY ORDAINS:

That Ordinance No. 89-294A, Exhibit B, FY 1989-90 Budget, and Exhibit C, Schedule of Appropriations, are hereby amended as shown in Exhibits A and B to this Ordinance for the purposes of recognizing new Transportation Planning grants and expenditures, adding four positions to the Transportation Department and increased capital computer equipment in the Transportation and Planning & Development Departments

FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

This ordinance provides the necessary budget amendments for the following items:

Transportation Planning Grants

The FY 1989-90 budget included \$558,274 of grant revenue for the I-205 Alternatives Analysis/DEIS. That grant request has since been increased to \$963,985 of federal funds. In addition, within this fiscal year, funds for the Milwaukie and Hillsboro corridors will be received for \$1,559,750 and \$518,400 (federal), respectively. For purposes of this budget amendment, only the increased funds projected to be needed in this fiscal year are being budgeted. Of the remaining monies, the Hillsboro grant will be budgeted and spent out in FY 1991 with I-205 and Milwaukie two-thirds expended in FY 1991.

The corridor studies, plus the Bi-State Study that was recently incorporated into the FY 1990 UWP, and additional analysis on the Western Bypass for ODOT will require more staff than currently budgeted. The proposed budget increases this year's FTE by 1.65. For the light rail studies, we are requesting three positions equaling 1.15 FTE this year: one Associate Transportation Planner at .5 FTE and, contingent upon receipt of the Milwaukie Alternatives Analysis grant, another Associate Transportation Planner at .25 FTE. Also being requested for the light rail studies is .4 FTE of a Senior Regional Planner to do community involvement for all three LRT corridors. Past experience indicates that a strong community involvement program is vital to the success of the chosen alternative. One new position in the travel forecasting section is needed for additional forecasting and modeling work created by the LRT studies, the Bi-State Study and the Western Bypass, none of which were budgeted. A Senior Transportation Planner at .5 FTE this fiscal year is requested in this amendment.

The Materials and Services appropriation is being increased to allow several line item increases. Several jurisdictions will receive pass-through funds from the LRT grants, necessitating increasing the

Payments to Other Agencies' line item. Other line item increases include Ads and Legal Notices for RFPs, Printing, Computer Software and Travel.

This amendment will increase Planning Fund Revenues for FY 1989=90 by \$164,405. Correspondingly, Transportation Personal Services will increase \$66,560 (1.35 FTE) and Materials & Services will increase \$97,890. Personnel has reviewed the requested position levels and have found them consistent with the duties and responsibilities of each classification.

This action does not require a supplemental budget. Oregon Budget Law, ORS 294.326 (2), allows the expenditure of grants in the year of receipt if the grants are received or transferred to the municipal corporation in trust for a specific purpose.

Increase Capital Computer Needs

Transportation Department - Several events are occurring at this time which necessitate increasing the computer capacity earlier than anticipated. Unbudgeted and unscheduled studies such as two additional Alternatives Analyses (Hillsboro and Milwaukie) and the Bi-State Study and the Western Bypass support require complicated travel forecasting models beyond the current ability to respond within reasonable limits.

Also, the Regional Land Information System (RLIS) is much further along in its development than anticipated. Additional CPU capacity is needed now to keep up with the increased demand. Two additional Macintosh IICX machines are needed to give full access to RLIS staff, allowing for full utilization of the Systems capabilities. Attachment A lists all Transportation Department computer needs for FY 1989-90.

In order to accommodate the additional upgrades, certain budgeted items such as the Ethernet are being delayed until next year. Even with reductions of these items, an additional \$11,500 will be needed to purchase the upgrades.

This action proposes \$11,500 to be transferred from the Planning Fund Contingency to Capital Outlay, Office Furniture and Equipment within the Transportation Department.

Planning & Development - The FY 1989-90 Adopted Budget allocated \$19,000 to link the Planning and Development Department with the RLIS system located in the Transportation Department. This link was designed to assist the Department with all program areas of land use, water quality study, parks study and Solid Waste system design. The Planning & Development Department is also designated as the Solid Waste Department contact for all RLIS needs. The level of use for the

present RLIS system is heavier than anticipated. The Planning & Development Department must purchase more costly equipment to meet these needs and avoid conflict with the Transportation Department RLIS needs.

This action would transfer \$9,400 from Materials & Services, Miscellaneous Professional Services, to Capital Outlay, Equipment to cover the additional cost of the RLIS station.

NOTE: This ordinance assumes adoption of Ordinance No. 90-311.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

The Executive Officer recommends adoption of Ordinance No. 90-327.

- Increase RLIS CPU greater than originally budgeted due to increased load for applications greater than anticipated.
- 4. Reduce disk acquisition to add 750 Mb disk to existing box; defer additional acquisition to FY 1990 when optical disk technology has improved.
- Defer network installation until decision on Masscomp upgrade or replacement is decided in FY 1990 budget; major portion of network installation involves Masscomp expense which should not occur if Masscomp is replaced.
- 6. Add 1 PC based version of EMME/2 to supplement Masscomp capacity on a short term basis until decision on Masscomp upgrade or replacement is decided in FY 1990 budget. Masscomp replacement could involve further acquisitions of PC based versions of EMME/2 or expansion of multi-user system like the Masscomp.
- 7. Install 9-track tape drive to H.P. for digital transfer of RLIS data; simplifies transfer process which would otherwise require transfer via 9-track to A-Series to PC to H.P. creating multiple opportunities for error. Original approach was based upon an H.P. bid of \$20,000 which can now be accomplished through a third party vendor for \$4,500.

- 8. Add two Macintosh IICX machines for RLIS access. One is to replace current PC used for responding to sales requests and one is an added RLIS terminal to increase productivity of staff involved in data entry to create RLIS database.
- 9. Add centralized printer for general staff access as a short term alternative to providing a network connection for PCs to access to secretaries' printer. Centralized printer would be a low cost laser printer or ink jet printer rather than multiple dot matrix printers.

Total budget increase is \$11,500 for EMME/2 computer capacity to respond to increased work load associated with more complicated travel forecasting models and more studies than originally budgeted: Hillsboro LRT, Milwaukie LRT, Bi-State Study, Western Bypass support to ODOT.

<u>COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION</u>: At the December 21, 1989, Finance Committee meeting, all members were present and voted unanimously to recommend Council adoption of Ordinance No. 90-327.

COMMITTEE DISCUSSION/ISSUES: Transportation Department Director Andy Cotugno presented the ordinance which provides for three groups of Planning Fund actions as summarized in the Intergovernmental Relations Committee report following. Mr. Cotugno explained the three actions —— (1) increasing light-rail (LRT) work, funded by Federal grants for 4 new positions; (2) increasing the Regional Land Information System (RLIS) computer memory capacity; (3) transferring funds with the Planning & Development Department to upgrade a satellite RLIS work station —— were requested now because of funding opportunities and workload changes unanticipated when the FY89-90 budget was developed. Responding to further Committee questions about the timing of new Transportation hires and Metro building space changes, Mr. Cotugno said one new staff person included in this year's budget would begin January 15, 1990. Of the 4 new hires under this ordinance, Transportation hoped to have one of them on board by late January.

Councilor Van Bergen stated for the FY90-91 budget process he will want to see a summary of Transportation Department staffing and positions since FY1984-85. He noted this information will be requested from all departments because he is concerned about slowly increasing staffing levels. The 4 new Transportation positions will be filled only as Federal funds are received to conduct alternatives analyses for the I-205 and Milwaukie Corridors. Mr. Cotugno recalled the Westside LRT alternatives analysis from 1979 to 1982 required extra staff but those positions were eliminated afterwards. No additional issues were raised and Mr. Cotugno noted the department will issue a complete RLIS update report at the beginning of the new year.

<u>COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION</u>: At the December 19, 1989, Intergovernmental Relations Committee meeting, all members were present and voted unanimously to recommend Council adoption of Ordinance No. 90-327.

<u>COMMITTEE DISCUSSION/ISSUES</u>: Ordinance No. 90-327 provides for three groups of Planning Fund actions:

- 1) Receipt of increased lightrail (LRT) Federal grant monies for the Transportation Department and related expenditures to hire four new staff and purchase associated computer hardware;
- 2) Increasing computer capacity to support the Regional Land Information System (RLIS), which is developing faster than anticipated, and upgrading the travel forecasting computer system to meet increased usage (delaying any major system changes until a more complete needs assessment is done);
- 3) Shifting Planning & Development Department Materials & Services (M&S) funds to Capital Outlay to upgrade the RLIS work station for solid waste system planning (eliminating the need to contract out for this work).

The December 4, 1989, Staff Report details the budget changes but the Ordinance provides overall for a \$164,405 increase in Planning Fund revenues for the Transportation Department RLIS work; an \$11,500 Planning Fund contingency tap for increased Transportation Department computer needs; and a \$9,400 Planning Fund transfer from M&S, Miscellaneous Professional Services, to Capital Outlay for the Planning & Development Department RLIS work station upgrade. A public hearing was convened, but no citizens came forward to testify.

As noted in the Staff Report, these budget changes do not require a supplemental budget because Oregon Budget Law (ORS 294.326 (2)) allows grant expenditures in the year of receipt if they are received or transferred to the municipal corporation in trust for a specific purpose. Transportation Director Andy Cotugno said Metro's FY89-90 budget based LRT funding on one alternatives analysis for the Westside corridor but the available Federal funds will allow Metro to conduct two more alternatives analyses for the I-205 and Milwaukie corridors. Mr. Cotuano confirmed that any staff hires or additional contractual work supporting the LRT studies will only occur as grant monies are received. Committee discussed the new LRT community involvement staff person and why the position is in Transportation and not Public Affairs. has been no consistent Metro practice for this type of position and careful coordination with Public Affairs, the City of Portland and other concerned parties will be an integral part of the position's duties.
