ORDINANCE NO. 91-402A, AMENDING THE FY 1990-91 BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS SCHEDULE FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING INCREASED EXPENSES IN THE COUNCIL DEPARTMENT

Date: June 10, 1991 Presented by: Councilor Van Bergen

<u>COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION</u>: At its June 6, 1991 meeting the Committee voted unanimously to recommend Council adoption of Ordinance No. 91-402 as amended. All Committee members were present and voting.

COMMITTEE DISCUSSION / ISSUES: Don Carlson, Council Administrator, presented the staff report. He indicated the original ordinance was proposed to transfer \$2,785 from the Materials and Services category to the Capital Outlay category to cover the costs of a personal computer purchased last fiscal year but charged to the current fiscal year. Mr. Carlson presented an amendment to the ordinance for several additional requested expenditures that have surfaced since the original ordinance was introduced (see Attachment 1 to this report). Specifically the amendment would transfer \$16,700 from the Election Expense line item in the Materials and Services category to cover costs for certain Personal Service expenditures (\$4,800) and the purchase of Capital Outlay items (\$11,900).

Please find attached a proposed amendment to Ordinance No. 91-402 which amends the FY 90-91 Council Department budget.

The amendment requests that \$16,700 be transferred from the Election Expense line item in the Materials and Services category to various line items in the Personal Services and Capital Outlay categories. The specific amounts and line items for expenditure are as follows:

- o \$2,100 to the Senior Management Analyst line item to fund a potential merit increase for a Council Analyst.
- \$2,700 to the overtime line item to fund overtime costs for Council and Committee Clerks, mainly for the FY 91-92 budget process.
- o \$11,900 to the Office Furniture and Equipment line item to fund 1) a computer purchase budgeted in FY 89-90 but expensed in FY 90-91 (\$2,800); 2) the purchase of a copy machine (\$6,900); and 3) the purchase of a FAX machine (\$2,200).

In regard to the purchase of a copy machine, the FY 91-92 budget includes funds for a maintenance contract for the copy machine. The Budget Committee included such funds in the FY 91-92 budget on the assumption that the copier would be purchased in the FY 90-91 fiscal year.

In regard to the FAX machine, the Department of Finance and Management Information is conducting a study of FAX machines for the Metro Center offices. This study is a result of several requests in the FY 91-92 by individual departments for FAX machines. Based on preliminary results of the study, it appears that it would be cost effective for the Council Department to have one of the machines scheduled for the second floor of the building.

The advantage for Council use of such machine is the potential for reducing mailing costs associated with the mailing of meeting agendas (not the entire agenda packet). The Council office mails

585 single sheet agendas twice each month for Council and committee meetings (see Attachment 1). Monthly postage costs are \$339.30 for these mailings. Assuming one third of the persons on the mailing lists have FAX machines postage costs could be reduced by approximately \$112 per month. Based on this assumption the machine could be "paid for" in approximately 20 months. Attachment 2 shows the proposed cost and characteristics of the potential fax machine. The mailing lists would be stored on a computer which is connected to the FAX. The transmission would be done automatically either during the day or in the evening.

Finally, the Department of Finance has not completed its analysis, so Council staff will not proceed with this purchase until the overall analysis is done and we are assured that this purchase fits within an overall building plan.

#### FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

At the end of FY 1989-90, the Council Department purchased a computer and printer for the office. This expense was to have been charged to FY 1989-90, but was actually charged to this fiscal year instead. When added to authorized expenditures for FY 1990-91, this has resulted in the Department exceeding its budget for Capital Outlay. This action requests the transfer of \$2,785 from the General Fund Contingency to Capital Outlay in the Council Department.

#### EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

The Executive Officer recommends adoption of Ordinance 91-402, transferring \$2,785 from the General Fund Contingency to fund increased capital outlay expenditures in the Council Department.
