

Dear Councilor:

The West Multnomah Soil and Water Conservation District needs to have one of our elected Directors included as a regular WRPAC (Water Resources Policy Advisory Committee) member. The person we recommend is Elizabeth Callison. We anticipate there should be no difficulty in making this transition.

Ms. Callison is very familiar with the work of WRPAC and has regularly attended meetings since 1995. As a Watershed Council Alternate (non-voting) member, she has served on WRPAC for the past year. Ms. Callison can continue to represent the Tryon Resource Management Partnership, a watershed council which is partially sponsored by our District and which was convened by Multnomah County in 1995. (Brian Lightcap will serve as her alternate.)

There are several other watershed councils and Soil and Water Conservation Districts which are represented on WRPAC. The Johnson Creek Watershed Council is represented by its staff, an employee of the East Multnomah Soil and Water Conservation District. EMSWCD has representation on WRPAC by its staff, as well. The Washington County Soil and Water Conservation District has a regular membership position on WRPAC, as does an employee of the Tualatin River Watershed Council. The Clackamas County Soil and Water Conservation District has a regular membership on WRPAC, and the Clackamas River Basin Council also has a position.

The West Multnomah Soil and Water Conservation District comprises all of westside Portland and portions of unincorporated Mutnomah County south of Portland to Lake Oswego, as well as northwest of Portland along Skyline Boulevard and into Sauvies Island.

Our district is represented by a Board of Directors, all of whom are elected within subdistricts of West Multnomah County for four-year terms. Our geographical area, economics, and resources are unique, and, we believe our Directors' years of experience would greatly benefit the WRPAC effort.

GROWTH MAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. 99-2781A, FOR THE PURPOSE OF APPOINTING ELIZABETH CALLISON TO THE WATER RESOURCES POLICY ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

Date: May 13, 1999 Presented by: Councilor McLain

Committee Action: At its May 12, 1999 meeting, the Growth Management Committee voted 2-0-1 to recommend Council adoption of Resolution No. 99-2781A. Voting in favor: Councilors Bragdon and McLain. Councilor Park abstained from the vote.

Council Issues/Discussion: Resolution 99-2781, as introduced to committee, contained two names for nomination to WRPAC. The committee amended this resolution to contain only one nominee, Elizabeth Callison. The amended resolution also includes Brian Lightcap as her alternate to WRPAC. The other original nominee, Michael Weinberg, is now the subject of a separate resolution, 99-2793.

Ms. Callison will be representing the West Multnomah Soil and Water Conservation District, which itself was added as an eligible organization, by WRPAC vote and by Resolution 99-2780, approved by the Growth Management Committee, May 12, 1999.

Councilor Park moved to place the nominees in separate resolutions, since he felt that Ms. Callison's nomination presented a unique situation for the committee. Ms. Callison was an unsuccessful candidate for Metro District #1, and Councilor Park proposed that another committee might be better positioned to consider her nomination.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Metro Water Resources Policy Advisory Committee (WRPAC) was formed in the early 1980s to advise the Metro Council on technical matters related to regional water resource planning.

WRPAC was formally organized and re-formed via Resolution No. 96-2418A which adopted a membership list of entities/persons to serve on WRPAC.

WRPAC's bylaws were revised and adopted by the Metro Council via Resolution No. 96-2321B. Section 2(B) of the Bylaws states: "Representatives and their alternates will be formally appointed by the Metro Council."

The Clackamas County Soil and Water Conservation District has nominated Michael Weinberg to represent them, replacing Don Guttridge, with Susan Hudson as the alternate.

On April 12, 1999 WRPAC voted to change their Bylaws by eliminating the Natural Resources Conservation Service voting position/seat (No. 20 on the WRPAC roster) and adding a seat representing the West Multnomah Soil and Water Conservation District (refer to Resolution No. 99-2780). That District has requested that Elizabeth Callison serve as their representative to WRPAC. Brian Lightcap was nominated to serve as her alternate, also.
