
THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN SERVICE DISTRICT HEREBY ORDAINS:



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TRANSPORTATION AND PLANNING COMMITTEE REPORT

ORDINANCE NO. 91-421A, FOR THE PURPOSE OF AMENDING THE REGIONAL WASTE WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO SUBMIT IT FOR RECERTIFICATION

Date: November 26, 1991 Presented by: Councilor Devlin

<u>COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION</u>: At the November 25, 1991 meeting, the Committee voted 4-0 to recommend Council approval of Ordinance No. 421A. Voting in favor were Councilors Devlin, Gardner, McLain and Van Bergen. Councilor Bauer was excused.

<u>COMMITTEE DISCUSSION/ISSUES</u>: Pat Lee, Regional Planning Supervisor, explained that the plan amendment is an annual process. This year, a minor change to the Collection System Service Areas Map is proposed, to reflect annexations by the City of Tigard.

Councilor McLain asked Mr. Lee to outline the status of matters discussed at the most recent meeting of the Water Resources Policy Advisory Committee (WRPAC). Mr. Lee said the City of Portland gave a presentation about a report which will identify long-term municipal and industrial water supply demand, opportunities for fulfilling need, and the water conservation program adopted last October. He said WRPAC also reviewed its relationship to the Regional Policy Advisory Committee which will be established under the Regional Urban Growth Goals and Objectives. Metro staff also presented information about water quality issues, with a report to the Transportation and Planning Committee anticipated for early 1992.

Councilor Van Bergen asked if information about water is included in the Regional Land Information System (RLIS), and if so, whether it provides a basis for reviewing the impact of the phosphorus ban. Mr. Lee said water information is not yet in RLIS. He said the Unified Sewerage Agency has been monitoring effluent coming to its plants for treatment, and has identified a twenty to twenty-five percent reduction in phosphorus.

A representative from the City of Portland Environmental Services Bureau told the Committee that the Bureau had not had an opportunity to comment on the amendment, and had received no notice of consideration of this item except the notice published in the Mr. Lee said that in the spring, jurisdictions are newspaper. asked to submit proposed revisions. He said that this recommendation comes directly from WRPAC to the Transportation and Planning Committee. Councilor McLain noted that this issue is maturing, and said that more people should be included in the information loop.

Council analyst Karla Forsythe recommended that the Committee adopt an amended version of the ordinance, in order to more clearly conform to language in the Metro Code. She said that department staff and legal counsel had reviewed the proposed amendment.

FACTUAL ANALYSIS

On June 31, 1991, the Water Resources Policy Advisory Committee (WRPAC) held it's annual meeting for the purpose of reviewing the Regional Wastewater Management Plan (208 Plan) at which the following amendment was adopted. The amendment concerns the modification of a collection area. An updated map is attached as Exhibit A.

<u>City of Tigard</u>

The collection system map has been changed to reflect relevant annexations.

BACKGROUND

The Federal Water Pollution Control Act of 1972 (Public Law 95-500), commonly known as the Clean Water Act, required the creation of a Regional Wastewater Management Plan, which was first adopted by the Metro Council in 1980. Since that time the Regional Plan has been periodically updated. The plan is now reviewed on an annual basis as part of Metro's continuing "208" Water Quality Program and was last amended November 1989.

The Clean Water Act, requires that the Regional Plan accurately identify the region's water quality management problems and their solutions, both short-term, and long-term. The Regional Plan must also delineate the region's water quality management service areas for collection, transmission and treatment of wastewater. Local jurisdictions are required to coordinate their plans with Metro and to comply with the Regional Plan prior to the allocation of federal funds for the construction or upgrading of any wastewater treatment facilities.

WRPAC was appointed by the Metro Council to advise them, and the Metro staff, on matters relating to water resources management.

The WRPAC meets annually to review the Regional Plan and to consider proposed changes and amendments. This year our meeting was held July 31, 1991. The changes and amendments are contained in the factual analysis section of the Staff Report.

Accompanying this Staff Report is a letter from the Executive

Director reporting on various matters relating to Water Resources issues.

Honorable Presiding Officer and Councilors:

The accompanying Staff Report lists the technical change to Metro's Regional Wastwater Management Plan which was recommended by the Water Resource Policy Advisory Committee at it's July 31, 1991 meeting. Because there is only one amendment, and it is a relatively minor one, it might be concluded that nothing much happened in the area of wastewater management in the Metro region last year.

The agencies who have responsibilities for wastewater management had a very busy year. The Tualatin River Basin furnished a good example of such implementation efforts. Under the terms of the Special Policies and Guidelines to Improve Water Quality within the Tualatin River Sub-basin adopted by the Environmental Quality Commission in June, 1989 and the Wastewater Facilities Plan published by the Unified Sewerage Agency in June, 1990, a number of activities have been undertake to reduce pollution in the Tualatin River:

1. Major modifications are underway at all wastewater treatment plants.

2. Preparation of a Recycled Wastewater Master Plan which will be released this summer.

- 3. Agreements with the City of Portland and the cities of West Linn and Lake Oswego and Clackamas County to deal with those portions of the sub-basin that lie outside of Washington County.
- 4. Implementation of the Phosphorus Ban in the Metro region on February 1, 1991.

Such implementation efforts have a considerable effect on water quality but do not show up in the "208" Plan updates.

The City of Portland increased it's efforts to deal with water pollution in the Willamette River caused by Combined Storm Sewer overflows, as part of their Clean River Program. A Stipulation and Final Order was agreed upon in July, 1991 describing the steps that must be taken over the next twenty years to abate the problem. Because the signing date was after June 30, 1991 this document was not included in the Plan.

Metro's Water Policy staff has also been engaged in a number of activities relating to water quality in general and wastewater management in particular.

Staff has continued to lead the efforts to digitize all of the Soil Survey data in the region. The digitization of the information in Washington County has been completed. The placing of soils data in Metro's Regional Land Informational System (RLIS) not only provides us with a powerful planning information tool, it also provides other jurisdictions and the private sector with a single source of invaluable information for use in erosion control, site development, greenspace preservation and other activities.

Staff has actively participated in the development and review of the Unified Sewerage Agency's Recycled Wastewater Master Plan which seeks to reduce the pollution of the Tualatin River by providing for the effective use of recycled wastewater by targeted users such as agriculture, golf courses, urban open spaces and wetlands.

Metro has applied to the Department of Environmental Quality for a grant to quantify the non-point source phosphorus contributions from the Fairview Creek Basin into the upper Columbia Slough. This work will aid DEQ during the TMDL setting process.

In 1990 the Metro Council adopted Ordinance No. 90-336 prohibiting the sale and distribution of cleaning agents containing phosphorus within District boundaries. This phosphorus ban went into effect on February 1, 1991. Staff facilitated the implementation of the ban in a singularly successful manner which resulted in the removal of the banned agents from commerce without the need of any enforcement proceedings. Staff also served on DEQ's Phosphorus Task Force which developed proposed legislation for a state-wide phosphorus ban which was eventually adopted by the State Legislature.

Metro's Water Policy Analysis group has been strengthened by the addition of a third member, Rosemary Furfey, whose initial assignments include a comprehensive study based on the water quality and quantity necessary to support the designated beneficial uses within the area.

All in all, this has been a challenging and productive year in the area of Wastewater Management within the region. We expect next year will be even more so.
